

What's New for LIGHTENUP

LIGHTENUP has exceeded our expectations in 2010 and we achieved another record year! Thanks to all of you who have made this program a success today and into the future.

These rebates mirror changes that the lighting industry is already well aware of: federal legislation has ended the manufacture of magnetic ballasts, and most T12 lamps will no longer be manufactured in 2012. While we are reducing rebates for retrofits to T12 lamps and magnetic ballasts, we are nevertheless continuing to offer them to maximize the energy savings being partially driven by federal legislation. Retrofits that include low-ballast factor ballasts, low-wattage T8s, and/or de-lamping will continue to be highly cost effective for customers.

Please review the following updates for each municipality and how it relates to your project(s).

What's New for Longmont for 2011?

Funding for Longmont LIGHTENUP projects will begin April 1, 2011 and will be required to be completed no later than December 15, 2011. The new Longmont lighting rebate values have been adjusted by nominally 25 to 30% from the rebate values listed in the table below that represents existing rebate values for Estes Park, Fort Collins, and Loveland. These new rebate values for Longmont lighting projects are designed to be combined with Boulder County's EnergySmart lighting rebates. What you need to know about Longmont LIGHTENUP projects:

EnergySmart is funded by the Department of Energy's American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) and is sponsored in partnership by Boulder County, the City of Boulder, and the City of Longmont.

What's New for Estes Park for 2011?

Estes Park is out of funding for LIGHTENUP projects for 2011. At this time we expect that funding will be available again for the 2012 calendar year, but we will update you if more funding becomes available before then.

What's New in 2011 for Fort Collins and Loveland?

The following incentive amounts will be automatically calculated in the next versions of the LIGHTEN**UP** applications and will be available on our website later this year.

What stays the same for all communities?

- Cap total rebates received per customer per year at \$50,000.
- ALL four foot T8 electronic ballasts must be "high efficiency". For a list of qualifying "high efficiency" ballasts, visit www.cee1.org or www.cee1.org/com/com-lt/com-lt-main.php3.
- Require the permanent removal of lamps, ballasts and sockets to qualify for rebates for delamping a fixture.
- We will not pay more than 100% of the project cost.
- Pre-approval is required if potential rebate is greater than \$1,000. Re-approval is required if the final rebate amount is projected to be more than 10% higher than the original pre-approved rebate amount.
- Maintain the simple payback <u>MAXIMUM</u> of 15 years (calculated with the incentive) for all projects.
- Providing more prescriptive lighting rebates in our new EEP application for refrigeration case lighting to T8 lamps/electronic ballasts or LEDs, replacing halogen torchieres or desk lamps to new ENERGY STAR rated compact fluorescents or LEDs fixtures, occupancy sensors/timers, vending machine controls, and more.
